

### **Guidelines to apply for the Perit Warrant for applicants with Foreign Qualifications.**

It is recommended to first contact the Board on [warrantingboard.mtip@gov.mt](mailto:warrantingboard.mtip@gov.mt) with your intention to apply for the Perit Warrant to guide you accordingly.

Please follow the below checklist for the application of the Maltese warrant through the following link <https://peritiwarrant.gov.mt/application-submission/>. If the applicants are already professionally registered in their home country (EU), points 2 and 3 are not required.

1. Proof of citizenship (National ID or Passport) of a member state of the EU or of permission to work in Malta under any other law
2. Certified true translations of your Academic Qualifications as well as a transcript of your studies
3. Proof of practice of your profession which you have carried out in Malta and abroad
4. If you are a registered professional at your home country, please submit details of this professional registration
5. A certificate of good conduct from the Police authorities or in the case of applicants not previously domiciled in Malta a similar document from the competent authorities in the country of domicile
6. Proof of proficiency in an official language (a) evidence that at least one (1) of the applicant's qualifications referred to in regulations 4 or 5 were received in one (1) of the official languages of Malta; (b) a MATSEC certificate, or an equivalent, in one (1) of the official languages of Malta at MQF level 3; (c) evidence of previous experience practicing the profession through the medium of English or Maltese in a country whose official language is English or Maltese for a period of not less than two (2) years in the past five (5) year period; or (d) evidence of the achievement of the minimum standard of proficiency as indicated in the Third Schedule. <https://legislation.mt/eli/si/622.1/20221227/eng>

### **Temporary and Occasional Provision of Services**

In order to apply for Temporary and Occasional Provision of Services, the following should be sent by email:

1. Proof of nationality of professional
2. An attestation certifying legal establishment in one's home state
3. Evidence of professional qualifications
4. Evidence that the professional is not prohibited from practicing even temporarily in his home state
5. Written declaration with details of professional indemnity or other protection relevant to the service that would be offered in Malta

All original documents and related copies are to be presented in English. Where translations are necessary these are to be Apostilled.

In addition, since the service is meant to be temporary and occasional, the type and duration of service to be offered should be indicated. Provisions of temporary service are provided for specific projects, thus the applicant would only be allowed to work on the project identified.
